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

Dreaming of big adventures? Mesa is your gateway to the Sonoran Desert, a legendary playground where epic experiences unfold on land and water. With the Tonto National Forest at its doorstep, trails invite hikers and bikers to explore rugged peaks, cactus-lined valleys and ancient petroglyphs. On the water, the Salt River and nearby lakes welcome kayakers, paddleboarders and tubers to glide past canyon walls or spot wild horses along the banks. As evening falls, desert skies glow with starlight, offering the perfect backdrop for reflection after a day of discovery. In Mesa, nature sets the stage for unforgettable adventures.

PADDLE, FLOAT & SURF

5 UNEXPECTED WAYS TO PLAY IN THE WATER

Surprised to hear Mesa and water in the same sentence? With two rivers and four lakes nearby, we're Arizona's closest destination to the water and the perfect place to stay, play and cool off.



PADDLE

Glide through scenic desert waters by stand-up paddleboard or kayak on the **Salt River**, **Canyon Lake** or **Saguaro Lake**. Rentals are easy through **Riverbound Sports** or let **Yak N Sup** lead the way on a guided tour (don't miss their dreamy nighttime glow floats under the stars).



FLOAT

Whether tubing or paddleboarding, get ready for a lazy river adventure of a lifetime. Pack a cooler, bring two cars for drop-off or ride the shuttle with **Salt River Tubing**. It's Arizona's floating picnic!



SKI

SKI

Jet ski, water ski or wakeboard across Mesa's desert lakes. Rentals are available on-site or nearby, so all you need to bring is your sense of adventure and extra sunscreen.



CRUISE

For a more relaxed adventure, board the iconic **Dolly Steamboat** at **Canyon Lake** or the **Desert Belle** at **Saguaro Lake**. These narrated cruises glide past rugged canyon walls and saguaros, offering views of desert wildlife and scenic coves. If you time it right, you'll see the desert light up gold at sunset.



SURF

Catch real waves at **Revel Surf Park** at **Cannon Beach**, where the surf lagoon and real sand feel like an actual beach in the middle of the desert.



SALT RIVER KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Tucked within the Tonto National Forest, the **Salt River** offers a refreshing desert escape, but there are a few essentials to keep in mind to protect the river and enjoy it responsibly:



Nearly 300 **wild horses** roam the shorelines of the Lower Salt River—stay at least 50 feet away.



Best conditions for **kayaking**, **SUP** and **tubing** are typically mid-April to mid-October. Check water levels before embarking on your water adventure.



A **Tonto Pass** is required for parking. It's \$8.00 and available at most nearby gas stations.



This is a carry-in, carry-out area; always **leave no trace**.

THE BEST HIKES & BIKES FOR EVERY LEVEL

Mesa sits at the edge of Arizona's most iconic landscapes, making it the perfect basecamp for every kind of trail seeker.

With the **Superstition Mountains** and **Usery Mountain Regional Park** nearby, you'll find cactus-lined paths, ancient petroglyphs and panoramic views just minutes from town. Many of these same trails double as prime mountain biking routes, offering everything from smooth, beginner-friendly loops to heart-pounding climbs and technical descents.


DESERT TRAILS PARK EASY TO MODERATE

A community-built gem, **Desert Trails Park** offers a compact but thrilling playground for mountain bikers of all levels. Flow trails, jump lines, pump tracks and skill features let riders progress at their own pace, while the surrounding desert keeps the scenery as exciting as the ride. It's the perfect spot for families, new riders or anyone looking to sharpen their skills before tackling bigger backcountry rides.



MERKLE TRAIL EASY

Located in **Usery Mountain Regional Park**, this smooth, scenic loop is stroller friendly and wheelchair accessible, ideal for all abilities. At just under a mile, it's perfect for a short stroll with 360-degree views of breathtaking desert scenery, blooming wildflowers in spring and occasional glimpses of local wildlife.



HIEROGLYPHIC TRAIL MODERATE

Tucked into the **Superstitions**, this 3-mile round-trip trail leads to a canyon dotted with ancient petroglyphs and seasonal pools. It's a family-friendly favorite with just enough incline to feel like an adventure.



PERALTA CANYON TRAIL MODERATE TO DIFFICULT

One of the most popular hikes in the **Superstition Wilderness**, this 4.6-mile trail climbs through rugged terrain and delivers unforgettable views of **Weavers Needle**. It's challenging but deeply rewarding for experienced hikers. While the main route is hiking-only, the surrounding Gold Canyon area offers a network of rugged, technical mountain biking trails where riders can chase equally epic views and heart-pumping climbs.



WIND CAVE TRAIL MODERATE

This 3.2-mile round-trip ascent up **Usery Mountain** delivers sweeping valley views and a natural rock alcove at the top. Watch for desert bighorn sheep and blooming ocotillo along the way. While the main route is strictly for hiking, mountain bikers can tackle the park's surrounding network of desert singletrack, weaving through saguaros and tackling rolling hills before or after a leg-burning hike to the cave.

DESERT SKIES AFTER DARK

WHERE THE STARS COME OUT TO PLAY

With wide-open desert views and low light pollution, Mesa is a dream for stargazers. Whether you're an aspiring astronomer or just in it for the views, all you have to do is look up.




Catch a First Friday show at the **Mesa Community College Planetarium**, where engaging programs for all ages explore everything from galaxies to black holes. Tickets often sell out, so plan ahead.

Want to pair your stargazing with something unexpected? **Dolly Steamboat's Twilight Astronomy Cruises** glide across **Canyon Lake** where guests use onboard telescopes to spot stars and planets. On the water nearby, **Yak N Sup's Glow Floats** bring a magical vibe to moonlit stand-up paddleboarding.

Back on land, **Usery Mountain Regional Park** and **Lost Dutchman State Park** host seasonal astronomy nights and full moon hikes. Expect telescopes, expert guides and views you won't forget.

For something truly off the beaten path, **Stellar Adventures** offers guided desert stargazing tours, complete with a pro astronomer and a Hummer ride under the constellations.

No matter where you go, Mesa's desert skies don't disappoint.

THE INFAMOUS COUGAR SHADOW

Just east of Mesa, the Superstition Mountains host a rare natural spectacle known as the Cougar Shadow. This awe-inspiring phenomenon occurs only twice a year, around the third week of March and September, when the setting sun casts the shadow of a crouching cougar on the mountain's western face.

The shadow appears about 30 minutes before sunset and lasts for approximately 10 to 15 minutes. To catch this stunning sight, head to the area near Superstition Boulevard and Goldfield Road in Apache Junction.

Be sure to bring binoculars, water and a camera to capture this fleeting desert wonder.



THE ULTIMATE FAMILY ADVENTURE WEEKEND

TWO DAYS. ENDLESS ADVENTURE.

Between gold rush towns, wild animal encounters and star-filled skies, Mesa delivers big on family memories. Here's how to pack maximum fun into one unforgettable weekend.

DAY 1

ROAD TRIP ON THE APACHE TRAIL

Kick off your Wild West adventure with one of Arizona's most scenic drives: **Historic Highway 88**, better known as the **Apache Trail**. Begin at the **Superstition Mountain Lost Dutchman Museum**, where artifacts and exhibits bring the legends of the Lost Dutchman to life.

Just up the road, wander the **Goldfield Ghost Town**, an 1890s mining camp revived with creaking boardwalks, gold panning and Old West charm. Continue twisting through canyon walls until you reach Canyon Lake, where the **Dolly Steamboat** offers a tranquil cruise framed by desert cliffs and saguaro-studded slopes.

The road leads naturally to **Tortilla Flat** (population six—yes, really), where you can grab lunch in Arizona's quirkiest little town and top it off with a cone of the saloon's famous prickly pear ice cream.

Back in Mesa, make dinner a memory at **Organ Stop Pizza**. This local favorite combines hearty pies with the music of the world's largest Wurlitzer pipe organ, filling the dining room with everything from iconic movie themes to toe-tapping classics.

End the evening at **Usery Mountain Regional Park**. Away from city lights, a guided stargazing session reveals constellations, planets and, if you're lucky, a shooting star, the perfect finale to a day of desert discovery.

DAY 2

A WILD MORNING AT THE PHOENIX ZOO

Start your day at the **Phoenix Zoo**, one of the nation's largest nonprofit zoos and home to more than 3,000 animals across 125 acres. Stroll the lush Tropics Trail where monkeys swing overhead, stop at the giraffe deck for an unforgettable face-to-face, and wander the Arizona Trail to meet native wildlife like mountain lions and bobcats. Kids can splash and play at the Yakulla Caverns water zone, hop aboard the Safari Cruiser for a guided ride or brush goats at Harmony Farm. With immersive habitats, hands-on experiences and a mission rooted in conservation, the Phoenix Zoo blends education and adventure in ways that make every visit feel like a journey across the globe.*

Refuel in the middle of Downtown Mesa at **Worth Takeaway**, a local favorite known for hearty, scratch-made sandwiches. Their fried chicken sandwich is legendary, while their rotating specials keep things exciting.

After lunch, choose your own adventure: dig into dinosaurs and pan for gold at the **Arizona Museum of Natural History**, or spark creativity across the street at the **idea Museum**. Don't miss a stop at **Outcast Doughnuts**, where whimsical creations piled high with unexpected toppings will help you end the afternoon on a sweet note.

Wrap up the weekend at **Saguaro Lake Guest Ranch**. Beneath the towering Bulldog Cliffs, families can gather for cowboy barbecue, live music and a sunset that paints the sky in desert hues: a fitting close to two days of Mesa adventures.







UNPLUG & UNWIND



Beneath the towering Bulldog Cliffs and along the banks of the Lower Salt River, Saguaro Lake Guest Ranch offers a unique escape into Arizona's Sonoran Desert.

Originally built in the 1930s to house workers building the Stewart Mountain Dam, the ranch now welcomes guests to 20 rustic cabins adorned with Western art and style. Without phones, TVs or radios, this is a true unplugged retreat, where adventure awaits right outside your cabin door.

Launch right from the ranch's riverbank for a kayaking journey down the Salt River. Or saddle up for guided horseback rides ranging from scenic sunrise strolls to stunning sunset treks—you might even get a chance to cross the river when water levels are low.

Prefer to keep it low-key? Lounge by the pool, challenge friends to a game in the lodge or gather around the fire pit under a star-filled sky. In fall and spring, seasonal cowboy cookouts bring visitors together for hearty ranch-style meals and live entertainment.

Whether you're chasing outdoor adventure or simply craving a slower pace, **Saguaro Lake Guest Ranch** delivers an authentic Arizona experience you'll remember long after you've headed home.



MESA'S WILD SIDE

DISCOVER THE DESERT'S MOST ICONIC CREATURES

Mesa's wild residents have a way of slowing you down and drawing you in. The Tonto National Forest is not only a playground for adventurers but also for the remarkable variety of wildlife that calls this region home.

WILD ABOUT HORSES

Pack your camera and binoculars and head to the Salt River, where nearly 300 wild horses roam freely along the banks and call Mesa their home. Named "Arizona's Most Iconic Tourist Attraction" by Phoenix Magazine in 2025, these majestic creatures are a sight to see while floating down the river. Daily, the horses emerge from the surrounding desert to cool off in the water and graze on the underwater foliage. For those not looking for a float, another viewing point can be found at Coon Bluff and other recreational sites in the Tonto National Forest. Just remember to admire them from a safe distance of at least 50 feet to protect both you and the herd.



ICONIC BIRDS OF ARIZONA

As you paddle down the river or hike up one of Mesa's mountains, be on the lookout for Arizona's remarkable birds. More than 350 species of birds are found in the Sonoran Desert, including bald eagles, herons, roadrunners, flycatchers, loons, hummingbirds and more. Keep your eyes on the towering saguaro cacti—the largest cactus in the United States and found only in the Sonoran Desert—and you may spot a Gila woodpecker nesting inside. Early mornings are prime bird-watching hours.

FIND YOUR FLOW IN MESA

From sunrise stretches to rose-scented walks, Mesa is where slowing down feels natural.

BEGIN AT THE MESA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ROSE GARDEN, the largest in the Southwest, where more than 9,000 blooming rose bushes set the tone for a day of calm and serenity. Located on Dobson and Southern, this garden encourages you to take a minute to stop and smell the roses, as there are over 300 varieties offering different shapes, colors and fragrances to view and admire. The best blooms appear in late March through June, and again in November and December.*




SAVOR THE SUNSET as you wander to the **Mesa Arizona Temple** grounds, named one of the nation's top 20 most peaceful tourist spots. Stroll its serene gardens and reflective pathways, then mark your calendars for one of the many free public events held here throughout the year. From the dazzling Mesa Temple Christmas Lights to the world-renowned Mesa Easter Pageant (a community tradition since 1938), there is something for everyone to enjoy.*

CREATIVE SOUL ON DISPLAY

MESA'S WORLD-CLASS MUSEUMS AND MURALS

If streets could talk, Downtown Mesa would be singing.

Along Main Street, 30 vibrant murals splash color across brick walls while 36 whimsical sculptures greet visitors on every corner. These works of art aren't just photo ops—they're story portals, highlighting local legends, pop-art flair and tributes to Arizona's roots, turning a simple stroll into a self-guided gallery walk.



Creativity here doesn't stop at the sidewalk. Mesa's museums invite you to step inside and connect with the city's creative and cultural heartbeat. The **Mesa Arts Center**, the Southwest's largest arts and culture complex, houses theaters, studios and the **Mesa Contemporary Arts Museum**—where visitors can explore five dynamic galleries with free admission. It's a playground for the imagination, with rotating exhibitions and immersive hands-on workshops.



W2ND Historic Inn feels like part of Downtown Mesa's gallery walk. Just steps from Main Street murals, this restored inn blends heritage architecture with curated design. Each room is styled with artful detail, echoing the creative pulse outside its doors. For travelers chasing culture, it's not just a stay—it's another canvas in Mesa's living arts scene.*



Just a block away off Main Street, the **Arizona Museum of Natural History** roars with life. Kids (and kids at heart) can wander through dinosaur hallways, explore ancient Hohokam canals and even pan for gold.

Also within a block of Main Street, the **idea Museum** sparks creativity with interactive exhibits designed to engage young minds in art, science and design—perfect for a family day in the city's cultural core.



For aviation enthusiasts, the **Arizona Commemorative Air Force Museum** takes history to the skies with an extensive collection of restored military aircraft. Visitors can walk beneath the wings of World War II bombers and fighters, examine artifacts and exhibits that detail aviation history, and learn about the men and women who served in the air. For those seeking a hands-on experience, the museum also offers flights in select vintage warbirds.*



Mesa's love for storytelling continues at the **Mesa Historical Museum**, where exhibits span local citrus-farming roots, the whimsical world of Karen Kuykendall and her famed "Cat People" and Mesa's proud Spring Training baseball legacy.


Beyond the city center, history lovers can follow the call of the **Superstition Mountain Lost Dutchman Museum** along the Apache Trail. This treasure trove of Old West artifacts and mining tales sits in the shadow of the legendary Superstition Mountains, where folklore and frontier spirit still linger in the desert air.

YOUR GUIDE TO Mesa's Asian District



Mesa's **Asian District** stretches for two miles along Dobson Road between Main Street and Southern Avenue, a cultural corridor that has blossomed over decades into a hub of more than 100 restaurants, grocery stores and shops. What started as a handful of family-owned businesses has grown into one of Arizona's most authentic windows into Asian culture, welcoming curious foodies, shoppers and culture seekers alike.

START WITH YOUR SENSES

Let the Asian District's vibrant signage and colorful murals pull you inside, where savory aromas like sizzling Korean BBQ, steamed bao buns and slow-simmered ramen drift from family kitchens and food courts, all set to the lively buzz of a thriving and welcoming community.




GOT A SWEET TOOTH?

The district doubles as a dessert playground. Think boba teas, creamy shaved snow, coconut jelly and the viral treats that light up social media, from realistic fruit-shaped ice cream to flaky spiral croissants and golden cheese coins. To taste the district properly, follow the locals into the food courts, where multiple vendors share the spotlight and the dining adventure feels endless.



A VISUAL GALLERY OF CULTURE

Food is only the first flavor of this neighborhood. Mesa's Asian District is also dotted with 15 colorful murals that celebrate heritage and community. Be prepared to turn an ordinary walk through the district into an art stroll where every corner invites a pause and a photo.



SPECIALTY SHOPPING

Shopping in Mesa's Asian District is an experience all on its own. Shelves at **Hong Kong Gifts** and **Daiso** brim with quirky trinkets, stationery and character-themed treasures. Meanwhile, the sprawling aisles of **H Mart**, **Asiana Market** and **Mekong Supermarket** overflow with imported spices, fresh produce and ingredients you won't find in your average grocery store.

Mesa doesn't just host music—it makes music. That foundation fuels a venue scene that punches well above its weight. Start big under wide desert skies at **Mesa Amphitheatre**, where major touring acts light up the night. Just down the road, the century-old **Nile Theater** pulses with rock and indie energy, hosting garage bands on the rise and acts you'll brag about seeing before they break. The **Mesa Arts Center** delivers world-class acoustics for everything from jazz trios to full orchestras.

Longtime favorite **T.C. Eggington's** keeps things classic and comforting with buttery omelets, cinnamon-kissed French toast and waffles that feel like home. Across town, **What's Crackin' Café** cranks up the fun with colorful plates, piled-high hashes and stuffed breakfast burritos that hit every craving.



Steadfast Coffee and **Steadfast Diner**, both located within steps of the Steadfast Farm at Eastmark, offer two farm-to-table moods in one: breakfast tacos and coffee from the Farm Store, and mouthwatering entrees and cocktails at the Diner.




Eggstasy lives up to its name with loaded skillets, silky Benedicts and fluffy pancakes, plus lighter options for those who want to linger over coffee. Every dish is polished, hearty and built to make mornings feel effortless.



At **Chilaquiles Modern Kitchen**, breakfast turns into an experience with their namesake dish, over-the-top pancake stacks and mimosa flights that offer a reason to gather and make any morning feel like a special occasion.



If you like your breakfast a little rebellious, **Outcast Doughnuts** tempts with wild, flavor-bomb creations topped with cereal, bacon and whatever the bakers dream up next.



Sweet-toothed visitors can find their fix at **Elysian Fields Artisan Bakery & Dainties**, where fresh pastries come with a side of glitter. It's a playful twist on classic sweets to brighten every morning.

Mesa is a true melting pot of cultures, and its dining scene makes that deliciously clear. Every plate tells a story, inviting you to travel the globe one bite at a time—no passport required.

 Start in South America at **República Empanada**, home to Arizona's largest selection of empanadas. Bite into a flaky, golden shell filled with beef, potatoes and green olives, or try a Cubana, a pastry homage to the Cuban sandwich. Then, finish with a Banana Cream Pie in empanada form.

 Journey next to coastal Mexico at **Espirito Cocktails & Comida**, where smoky Birria Dumplings and Whole Fried Snapper share the stage with inventive cocktails that burst with coastal flavor and color.

 The Caribbean calls at **Jerk Island AZ**, serving fiery jerk chicken and tender curry goat that pair perfectly with rice, peas and island vibes.

 Round out your travels with **Pacific Rim & Sushi** or **Mensho Ramen**, where Hawaiian plate lunches, velvety ramen and Duck Matcha Bowls bring Pacific flavors to downtown streets.

Arizona's Fresh Foodie Trail® isn't just about what's on the plate—it's about where it came from, who grew it and how it connects you to the land.

Winding through family farms, olive groves, you-pick orchards and urban gardens, this trail invites you to taste Arizona in the most authentic way possible: at the source.

In Mesa, the Fresh Foodie Trail connects working farms and garden-rich neighborhoods. **Steadfast Farm** grows organic produce served next door at **Steadfast Diner**, while **Healing Earth Farms—True Garden** supplies uniquely vertically grown greens. At **Vertuccio Farms** and **Agritopia**, pick your own peaches or citrus, depending on the season. And at **Inspire Farms**, fresh eggs, raw milk and friendly chickens offer a glimpse into urban homesteading.



The trail extends to **Queen Creek Olive Mill**. Arizona's only working olive farm and mill. Olives are grown, harvested and pressed on-site, creating award-winning oils that you can taste right where they're made. Tour the grove, then stay for lunch under the olive trees. From bruschetta to gelato, every dish is house-crafted—proof that a little slice of Italy can thrive in the Arizona desert.*



Just down the road, **Windmill Winery** serves up small-batch Arizona wines in a setting that feels like it was pulled from a postcard. Surrounded by vineyards, barns and blooming gardens, this is where wine meets wild charm. Grab a seat in the tasting room or out on the patio, then stick around for live music, food trucks and those slow desert sunsets that always steal the show.*



CHEAP EATS UNDER \$15

Traveling (and eating) with the family doesn't have to break the bank. Mesa is full of local favorites where a satisfying meal costs less than \$15.

Start at **Pete's Fish & Chips**, a true Mesa classic since 1947. They don't serve ketchup here—only Pete's signature special sauce. A full seafood combo (complete with fish, shrimp, fries, a drink and sauce) rings in at around \$11 and will keep everyone full and happy.

For a handheld feast, **Worth Takeaway** serves locally sourced, award-winning sandwiches under \$15. Favorites include the Cuban, Hot Ham & Cheese, Spicy Pork and the Chicken Tender Bites with fries, or opt for a lighter option with their Chicken Veggie Hash.

Craving something snacky? **The Salted Knot** turns pretzels into lunch with pretzel dogs, pizza knots and other warm, salty twists for about \$10.



Renegade Coffee keeps mornings affordable with a coffee, pastry and breakfast burrito combo for around \$13—perfect fuel before a day of exploring.

For a budget-friendly Mexican fix, **Backyard Taco** serves a 3-taco plate with rice and beans for around \$15, or time your visit for Burrito Monday or Taco Tuesday for even bigger savings. Mesa proves that flavor doesn't have to be fancy—just delicious, local and easy on your wallet.

And always go for the combo.**




There is something timeless about the right bite and the right sip-a combo that goes beyond flavor and brings the moment to life.

In Mesa, that story comes to life in local taprooms, patios, food trucks and brewpubs. It's where bold IPAs are served with stacked burgers, crisp ciders are paired with creative pizzas, and cocktails complement standout dishes without overcomplicating things.



FLAVORS, FUN & FUNKY FINDS

Just off Main Street, **Chupacabra Taproom** pours Arizona staples and rotating rarities in an inviting space where dogs and locals are equally welcome. Weekend food trucks keep the pairings fresh, so there's always a surprise worth sinking your teeth into.



Nearby, **BRI Taproom & Arcade** turns up the energy with a retro spin. Think pints, pinball and just enough friendly competition to justify staying for another round.



MVP COMBO

At **12 West Brewing Company**, the Charlie Hustle Burger steals the spotlight as it's stacked with sambal aioli and chimichurri and served with truffle fries. Pair it with their Hop Jam IPA, a 6.9% citrus-forward pour brewed with Superdelic hops. It's bold, balanced and built for flavor chasers.



HAUS RULES: BRATS & HAZY IPAS

At **Pedal Haus Biergarten**, the Haus Bratwurst-braised, grilled and served with mustard and sauerkraut-was made to pair with the White Rabbit Hazy IPA. This is the kind of place where one pint turns into two, and no one's in a rush to leave.



PINTS WITH A SLICE OF PERSONALITY

Phantom Fox Beer Co. is home to Tee Time, a summer brew that tastes like sunshine-lemony, tea-kissed and lightly tart. Pair it with a pepperoni and sausage pizza from **Goat & Ram**, the in-house kitchen that proves pizza and beer are soulmates.

Not into beer? No problem. **Cider Corps** is pouring a selection of creative ciders like the Mango Foxtrot which is tropical, crisp and even better with a slice of the potato and bacon pizza from **Myke's Pizza** inside.



WINE, SPIRITS & SOMETHING DIFFERENT

Rebel Wine Lounge serves a prosciutto and fig flatbread that pairs effortlessly with their Broken Dreams Chardonnay, a smooth California white with just enough flair.

For the cocktail lovers, **Espiritu Cocktails & Comida** offers the legendary Phoenix Cocktail. It's flavorful, bright and a dream alongside the braised K4 short rib.



BRING YOUR OWN COMBO

Award-winning **Oro Brewing and Vice Co.** keeps it simple with small-batch ales, a laid-back atmosphere and a bring-your-own-food policy that lets you call the pairing shots. Tacos, pizza, burgers—whatever you are craving is welcome at the table.

JUST IN IT FOR THE POUR?







TIPS TO TAME THE DESERT COURSES

PLAN FOR THE HEAT

They say "it's a dry heat" for a reason! Desert air pulls moisture fast. Early tee times are prime for cooler temps and golden light. Apply sunscreen before your round and keep a bottle in your golf bag for reapplication.

Bring a spare towel to keep your hands clean and to maintain a grip on your clubs. Consider light, long-sleeved shirts and pants made of performance materials to protect you from the sun.

MONITOR COURSE CONDITIONS


Did you know fairways in the desert can become firmer as the day warms up? At night, the desert cools off significantly, but as the sun rises, the ground quickly heats and dries, making fairways harder and faster. This means your ball could fly or roll further and you may need to reach for less club than usual.

If you're having trouble staying on fairways, consider teeing up your drives a bit higher to get more loft and land your tee shots softer.

RESPECT THE ROUGH... AND THE CRITTERS

The desert rough means cactus, rocks and the occasional critter. Take a good look before you go after an errant tee shot.

If your ball is lodged in a thorny bush, you have relief options under Rule 19 (Unplayable Ball). Or, with your group's permission, move it to the grass and save your club heads and ankles.



LAS SENDAS GOLF CLUB

Las Sendas Golf Club, designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr., is a championship 18-hole, par-72 course nestled at the base of the Usery Mountains. Ranked among Arizona's top 10, the course blends challenging desert terrain with sweeping views of the Phoenix Valley skyline, 1,800 feet above the desert floor.
